Leave of Absence Requests

All schools find at this time of year there is a marked increase in the number of Leave of Absence requests. If your child has a planned absence, you should fill in the Leave of Absence form, which is available from the school office or via our website on the downloadable forms tab. Your form will then be reviewed and you will be informed via email as to whether the absence has been granted or not.

Please note that we are not allowed to authorise holidays in term time, and that any other leave of absence requests would need to be exceptional circumstances for a request to be granted. Please also be aware that Fixed Penalty Notices may be issued for unauthorised leave of absence in term time where the absence amounts to five school days or more in a minimum ten rolling school week period, and that a fixed penalty notice will be issued to each person with parental responsibility.

Fun and Fitness Week

Children can come to school in sportswear all week (either PE kit or any sportswear) as they will be participating in different sporting events every day. Also, we have our Wheels Day on Thursday 22nd May. On this day, every child can bring a wheeled item to school and we will have a timetable for every year group to spend time on or in their wheeled items. This can be a bike, scooter, pram or pushchair. However, please note that if your child is riding a bike or scooter, then they MUST wear a cycle helmet. Please note, children will not be permitted to use skateboards, roller skates/blades, hoverboards on any electronic wheeled items.

Year 5 & 6 have their bike ride on the Thursday. Please start checking bikes to ensure brakes are in working order, tyres are blown up and the bikes are fit for purpose. Again, no child (or adult volunteer) will be allowed to take part in this ride unless they are wearing a cycle helmet. All parents/carers of children in Year 5 & 6 will have received an email this week to ask if they would like to volunteer to accompany us on this bike ride.
