Dear Parents and Carers,

We have had a busy week this week as we invited four local authority improvement partners into school on Wednesday to carry out a mini inspection. We hoped this would endorse our opinions on what we do well, agree with the areas we have identified for improvement and perhaps identify other areas where we can perhaps do even better. It was an incredibly useful day and they were all very complimentary about our school and especially your children. They were impressed with their behaviour, attitudes to learning, their resilience shown to their learning and care/respect of one another. We see this on a daily basis of course, but it is always reassuring when this is endorsed by those who visit numerous schools each week. They also commented that they wished more schools were like ours – a compliment that does mean a lot. Your children continue to make us very proud!

It is hard to believe that we break up for half term next Friday – half way through the academic year. We are closed for the week and look forward to welcoming everyone back on Monday 27th February.

Turing Visit to Dubai

We have a group of 24 children visiting Dubai, leaving on the Friday of half-term. This is another amazing opportunity for our school, thanks to funding from the Turing Scheme. During our week there, we will visit two of our partner schools, enjoy a unique learning experience at the mosque, enjoy an Emirati meal and cultural experience, as well as visiting some of the landmarks including the Burj Kalifa and the desert. I will be leading this visit and the other staff accompanying the children will be Miss Jackson, Miss Corper, Mr Knighton, Mr Bailey and Mr Southern. Mrs Tate will be teaching Mr Knighton's class whilst Mr McLoughlin will be teaching Miss Jackson's class. Mrs Grayson will be back to work full time after half term so she will be teaching her Year 5 class.
