Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been good to have a full week in school with the children and great to welcome Crazy Creatures into school in Year 1. I think Mr McLoughlin and Mr Innes were more wary than any of the children when touching the animals though!

I have had a very enjoyable week spending time in lots of classrooms where so much learning has been taking place. The children are so happy and hard-working and it has been great to learn alongside them in many classrooms!

Parking

Yet again, I am starting the year with issues to do with parking. It appears that parents and carers are parking on double yellow lines all around the school. I think what is important to note is that the double yellow lines are there because it is dangerous for cars to park there. This means that those drivers are putting our children at risk. Please try to park away from the area round school.

We have arrangements with the Kings Head – they are very happy for parents and carers to park there at drop off and pick up times. We also have arrangements with the Social Club who are more than happy for parents and carers to park there. In addition, the Community Centre are also happy for parents and carers to use their car park at these times – all they ask is that you become a Friend of the Community Centre at a very reasonable cost of £24 for the year. Please consider using these three car parks before attempting to park anywhere else. Thank you.

School Uniform and PE Kit Reminder

I would like to politely remind all parents and carers that we expect children to come to school in the correct school uniform every day. Most of our children do come to school looking very smart but we do have some who are perhaps trying to stretch the rules slightly. We would really appreciate your support in ensuring the children come to school every day dressed appropriately. Please familiarise yourself with our uniform policy, which is on our website – a guide to acceptable uniform has been added to this newsletter.

School Uniform

We ask children to wear fully black shoes (including the soles) with school uniform. Coloured trainers with normal school uniform is not acceptable.

PE Uniform

We have an increasing number of children coming in different coloured leggings for PE days. Our PE uniform clearly states that children should wear black tracksuit trousers or leggings. These must be plain black/those available from our supplier (without large logo designs). Hoodies must be the PE hoodies and not designer hoodies of any sort at all. If your child does not have a PE hoodie, they must come into school in their normal school jumper/cardigan.

Hair Styles

Please remember that our uniform policy states that tram lines in shaven hair is not permitted. Nor are extreme hairstyles or those that stand out. We try to be as flexible and understanding as possible but Mohican hair styles, coloured hair or shaven hair with tiny braids are all extreme. They draw attention to the child and can be a distraction to others, therefore they are not acceptable.

Jewellery

Again, jewellery is not permitted to be worn in school. This is for health and safety reasons as children can easily be hurt when wearing bracelets and necklaces. Earrings are also a huge concern which is why only studs are allowed to be worn in school. However, these should be removed for PE days. The only item of jewellery which is safe to be worn in a school environment is a watch but please note, smart watches are not permitted.

Staff News

Mr Taylor will be absent from school from Monday 22nd January due to a planned operation and providing that the operation actually takes place, will be absent for a number of weeks as he recuperates. Mrs Louise Swinbank will be taking over the teaching of the class. The children know her very well as she has been working alongside Mr Taylor since last year on her final teaching practice. This is an ideal situation for the children as the relationships are already strong and the transition will be seamless. I am sure you will all join me in wishing Mr Taylor the very best for his operation and a swift recovery.

Attendance

Our target for attendance is for 97% as a minimum. We feel it is important to share the data each week with you but think it is important to help and support you as much as possible in ensuring your child does attend school as regularly as possible. If your child is not feeling 100% in a morning and you are unsure what to do, please send them to school. If they become too unwell to stay in school, we will contact you. The only time we cannot have children in school is in the 48-hour period after a bout of sickness or diarrhoea. Punctuality

Please remember that the school doors open at 8.30am and close at 8.45am. We still regularly have children coming through the Office door as late as 8.50am and 8.55am. It really is important that all children arrive in school ready to START their learning at 8.45am. Thank you.

Key Stage One News

Year 2 have had a fabulous week, exploring their space topic, and building moon buggies in DT. They had to measure and make a wooden chassis, which involved cutting the wood using saws and then attaching axles to enable their buggies to move. Then, they needed to use their knowledge to design their creation to look

Key Stage Two News

We have had a busy week and a half since the New Year and the children have all settled back into the routines of school. Each year group have started a new topic for the coming weeks and we are well into the new novel or text linked to their work.



Year 3 - Escape from Pompeii by Christine Balit

We travel back in time to the days of the Roman Empire and join Tranio, the son of an actor, and his friend Livia, the baker's daughter, in witnessing the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in AD79. They witness one of the most terrifying moments in recorded history-the eruption of Mount Vesuvius and the destruction of their beloved city, Pompeii.

Year 4 - Stormin' Normans by Terry Deary

We will discover all the foul facts about the STORMIN' NORMANS, including why Norman knights slept with a dolly, which pirate hung up his eye-patch and became a saint and why Crusader ships were defended with barrels of pee.

Year 5 Secrets of a Sun King by Emma Carroll

Emma Carroll takes us back to the excitement of discovering a tomb and explores the young Pharaoh Tutankhamun in detail. Secrets of a Sun King is set in London 1922 and tells the story of a girl called Lillian who travels to Egypt with her friends in a desperate attempt to save her Grandad.

Year 6 - Percy Jackson & The Lightening Thief by Rick Riordan

Look, I never asked to be the son of a Greek god. I was just a normal kid. . . until I accidentally vaporized my maths teacher.

Percy Jackson is having a bad week. His life has gone from totally normal to monsters-from-Greek-mythologyrandomly-appearing kind of strange. Worse still, the king of the gods thinks Percy has stolen his all-powerful lightning bolt - and it seems making Zeus angry is a very bad idea.

Now Percy and his friends have just ten days to catch the true lightning thief and stop all-out war from erupting on Mount Olympus...

All children in our Key Stage 2 classes use these texts to take part in whole-class shared reading lessons. We teach comprehension skills using the reading domains from the National Curriculum. These are taught to children through our VIPERS approach to reading (vocabulary, infer, predict, explain, retrieve and summarise.)

Why not ask your child about their whole class book and how they are using it to learn about their topics?
