Dear Parents/Carers,

I have decided that our Turing trips abroad must be fated! Last June, the flight back from Montreal was cancelled, delaying the return of the group by over 24 hours. In January, all flights to Newcastle were cancelled due to the storms, meaning our group from India were unable to get home resulting in an overnight stay in London. Last week, our flight from Dubai was cancelled due to the fire near Heathrow resulting in an extra night in Dubai and a return flight to Glasgow followed by a minibus back to school. Great adventures for those involved and certainly very character building too.

You may have seen our school hit the headlines last weekend too, although it was very sensationalised! We were not 'stranded' in Dubai – just delayed. However, the papers and television ran it as quite a newsworthy story, filming the children for Newsround, myself for the BBC as well as showing the interview on NBC, the main US news channel.

What we did not share though was that whilst waiting in the airport, I slipped and fell awkwardly, ending up in a wheelchair for the next 24 hours with a torn hamstring and twisted knee. You really could not have written those 24 hours! However, the real team spirit of our school shone through. Mr Adamson pushed me around in a wheelchair, Mrs Knighton helped with all sorts, whilst the children just took it all in their stride, opening doors and helping me into the pool! I have kept a low profile this week, working on paperwork from home for some of the week, but am pleased to be back in school now, albeit hobbling around feeling rather sorry for myself!
