Year 6 Spring Term 2 - Parent Information Rainforest Kingdom

This term we are going to take a trek into the depths of the jungle and explore the rainforests. The Amazon Rainforest is the 'lungs' of our planet. What can we do to protect this delicate environment?

During this half term, we'll take a trip to the rainforest – perhaps not as far as the Amazon Rainforest in South America! We will visit the Tropical House at Durham's Botanic Gardens and experience the warm, humid environment of a rainforest, complete with (at the press of a button) real rain! Here we will find bananas, sugarcane, coffee and giant bamboo!

Our geography will focus on the rainforests of the world, including where they are located. We will study the different layers of the rainforest and find out what amazing plants and animals inhabit this lush ecosystem. Most importantly, we will examine the human impact on our tropical rainforests. We will find out about the impact of their destruction at a local, regional, national and international scale. We will think about what we can do at Lanchester EP to help stop the damage we are causing.




Helping your child prepare
