Water Bottles

After half-term, Year 1 will be learning in our beautiful forest every Friday morning. For this, they will need to have wellies in school (preferably ones that stay in school). We have waterproof suits available in school, but if you would prefer your child to wear their own waterproofs, please send them in each Friday, beginning on Friday 7th November. Children should wear PE kits on Fridays, as usual, but as we will be outside in all weathers, it is essential that they also have a warm coat, a hat and gloves to keep warm in the winter weather.

On Friday 28th November, we would like to invite Y1 families to join us in the forest so that we can share some poetry that we will be writing next half-term. Miss Wood's session will be from 9:30am to 10:15am and Mr McLoughlin's session will be from 10:30am to 11:15am. Brass Lessons from Durham Music Service

Children in Year 3 – 6 had a brass demonstration this week from Durham Music Service and some of their current brass students. If any of the children have been inspired by this demonstration, you can still sign them up for brass lessons through Durham Music Service via <u>Eepos: Durham Music Service</u>. Brass instruments offered are the trumpet, tuba, trombone and numerous different horns. If your child is entitled to Free School Meals then these lessons will be free of charge, otherwise lessons are charged at approx. £70 per term, with instrument hire at £47.00.

School Meals: Online Form

The new menu for Autumn Term 2 has now come out. If your child is wanting to have school meals next half term, please make sure you fill in their choices via the online form by **Sunday 19th October**. The new menu will then start on **Monday 10th November**.

Due to a number of issues with the menu system on Arbor, we will be reverting back to using the online form for dinners, so please do not choose your child's meals on Arbor for after half term, as it will be a different menu. For the first week back after half term we will be using Week 1 choices from the previous menu, which we have records of in school.

If your child requires a special menu, then please contact the school office. Those already on a special menu will have been sent a menu home which needs to be completed and then handed back into the office, to ensure the kitchen can cater for their specific needs.

Meals are free for pupils in Reception - Year 2. Meals for those in Nursery & Year 3 - 6 are £2.90 per day unless entitled to Free School Meals. Meals should be paid for on Arbor.

You must fill in the new menu via $\underline{\text{this online form}}$, or your child will be given the default vegetarian option for their school meals.

Christmas Shoe Boxes.

A number of children have asked about whether we are going to be taking part in a Christmas Shoe Box appeal again this year. For the last few years we have focused on collecting items for local food banks and on raising money for charities to buy children's toys, but we know a lot of families really enjoy packing the shoe boxes, picking out items and knowing that they are making a difference in another part of the world.

Having carefully looked at all the options, we have decided to register with **Link to Hope**, which is a charity working with people living in poverty in Eastern Europe. We felt it was important to work with a charity who provide items for people of all ages, so that no one is left out over Christmas.

The contents list for these boxes will be attached to the bottom of this letter, and official leaflets will be sent out as soon as they come into school. A contents list must be stuck onto the top of the shoe box to show what is inside. Each shoe box will need to be sent into school with £3, to cover the charities postage costs.
