A great day was had and enjoyed by all I think! The children particularly enjoyed all the adults reading stories to different classes – this was delightful too.

#### **Weekly Big Question**

We are starting to introduce a weekly Big Question which will be shared in Worship and then followed up with some reflection and discussion time in classrooms. This is so that you know what the Big Question has been and can then follow it up with your children at home over the weekend. This week's Big Question has been: 'What is the most Beautiful Thing in the World?' Ask your child to think about this!

Thank you for your patience during this period—You will now notice that when you phone school, our Head Boy and Head Girl's voices can be heard directing you to different options.

#### **Rock Steady Music School**

We are looking forward to welcoming Rock Steady Music School for a whole school assembly and demonstration to both KS1 and KS2 on Thursday next week. They are a company who help children learn to play an instrument in their very own band. All instruments for lessons are provided – keyboards, drums, bass and guitar. Lessons will take place on a Friday afternoon - further information will be shared after they have been into school. It is probably important to note that we have organised this due to pupil voice and some children in KS2 being keen to have their own band!

#### WhatsApp Groups

We know that there are many WhatsApp Groups amongst parents and that these can be very useful for parents and carers to remind each other about events taking place in school. However, there are a couple of things I would like to suggest regarding these groups.

Firstly, it is important for everyone to remember that once any messages have been posted, these are then in the public domain and can be copied, screenshot and shared quite openly. I would urge all parents and carers to remember this. These can, and sometimes are, shared with school staff, so please think carefully before posting any opinions or derogatory comments about children or staff.

Secondly, it is equally important that if you have an issue with something that has happened in school, rather than post on WhatsApp, just contact school so we can give you the correct, factual information. We can also answer any worries or concerns and deal with any issues. This helps everyone concerned. Thank you.
