Dear Parents and Carers,

This week has brought our long-awaited Ofsted inspection which was well overdue. We had not been inspected since September 2018 and have been expecting it at any time this academic year. With only a day's notice, it has meant planning of residentials and trips has been a slight challenge. Last week I took all my Ofsted notes and paperwork to Dubai and they have been to the desert, up the Burj Kalifa and all around Dubai – just in case the phone call came last week! The difference a week makes! The report will be published in due course but it does take a while for it to be written, checked and then published.

I would like to express enormous thanks to the whole school community for the amazing support we have all received this week. We have been overwhelmed with the number of emails, messages, cards, biscuits/cake and positivity sent our way from so many. The inspector commented on the huge number of families who responded to ParentView and added written comments too – all of which were overwhelmingly positive too. We are so grateful that so many of you took the time to respond and comment. Huge thanks to each and every one of you.

We have had another busy week with lots taking place. Dan Smith, the author who visited on Tuesday was quite inspirational. Year 1 had an amazing day in Newcastle to help kick start their topic of Bright Lights, Big City. We have had another good turn out to our Maths in Action lessons and World Book Day was just wonderful. The children were so excited coming into school in their outfits and pyjamas – you did them all proud once again – thank you! We also have 25 PGCE students on site from Durham University today enjoying a Forest Schools Session run by our staff. This is a great opportunity for tomorrow's teachers to see the great impact Forest Schools has on children.
