If we do not receive a response, your child will automatically be given the default vegetarian option. If your child is currently on packed lunches but would like to change onto school dinners, please inform the office in writing giving 2 weeks' notice and then complete the form with your child's choices.

Parents Evenings

Please remember, parents' evenings for this half term will be held on Monday 23rd and Tuesday 24th October between 3.30-6pm. Appointments will be available to book via your Arbor account from today for children in Reception to Year 6 and will close on Thursday 19th October. Nursery parents evenings will be communicated in due course.

SEND News

Class teachers are now in the process of reviewing SEN Support Plans and they will share these with parents and carers at parents' evening at the end of this half-term. We will also be holding an extra drop-in session with class teachers after school on Wednesday 15th November for parents and carers to have more time to discuss SEN support with their children's class teachers.

We are often asked if children with additional needs should have an EHCP (Education, Health and Care Plan). An EHCP may be put in place by the local authority if it is clear that children require more support in school than is ordinarily available through the SEN support plans already in place. The vast majority of children with SEN support plans will not receive an EHCP, as their existing plans set out the support they require. School staff will sometimes identify children who would benefit from having their needs met through an EHCP and an application for this will be made with support from parents and carers. However, an EHCP request can be made by any professional working with your child, as well as by parents and carers. To find out more about

School Carpark & Pedestrian Access
