Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a very busy but fulfilling week in school this week. Every day we have had something different happening — I think it is the same every day until the summer break now actually! We are just looking forward to it feeling a little more like the summer term and warming up soon. Our children have represented our school exceptionally well all week whether it is on day trips, sports events or residentials.

We have also had our younger children sit their Phonics Screening Test this week, hopefully without realising! At the same time, our Year 4 children have had their Multiplication Check this week too. We have been very proud of the attitude of both year groups and pleased that they have all completed these just as part of their normal lessons.

It was lovely to see so many prospective Reception parents at our Open Evening on Monday. Thank you all for coming and I do hope you found it useful. Please feel free to ask any questions at all if there is anything you are unsure about. September will be here before we know it!

We have 6 very lucky children currently enjoying life in Montreal. They left on Wednesday and are enjoying over 26°C heat and sunshine whilst practising their French buying pastries and ice cream. We do appreciate the staff giving up their own time and making all these residentials possible. Unlike many businesses and other lines of work, staff accompany children on all residentials for no recompense at all. They do not receive any financial incentives or time off in lieu, even though they are responsible for children 24/7. Staff are keen to accompany your children as they enjoy spending time with your children and the impact they have on their independence and resilience.

Our Year 5&6 Boys Football Team enjoyed a wonderful day on Monday completing all their football league games in one day. They played exceptionally well, were great sportsmen and amazingly won the league! This is a great achievement and testament to their skill and team work. Well done to them all. This was followed by some of our children representing our school in the Durham Dash at Beamish Museum. The place was packed and our children were once again, amazing ambassadors for our school. Fenn managed to win a silver medal in his race too – well done – and very well-deserved! We just need to wait to see how our Year 6 Boys get on in the cricket tournament today!

We are welcoming back Mrs Carley Clark on Monday after her maternity leave. It is quite frightening how quickly that time goes. We are thrilled to have her back with us though – welcome back Mrs Clark!

Unauthorised Absences for Holidays from September

New rules for September 2024 re: unauthorised absences - fixed penalty notices can be issued from September for 5 days or more absence (10 sessions) in a 10-week rolling period. This is changing from 7 days or more (14 sessions) in a 12-week rolling period. Please see the attached information from Durham County Council.

Lunch Pattern Reminder

As you are aware, all lunch choices are now selected in your child's Arbor account. This system seems to be working quite well however there are still a couple of glitches that we are working through. Can we please remind everyone that we cannot support a mixed lunch pattern due to the number of children in our school and our provision ordering system. Children must either have a packed lunch or school meal each day. If your child is on school dinners, can we also remind you to check you have selected a meal choice for **each** day on Arbor as there have been a couple of incidences where children have not had a meal choice selected for them on a particular day which can lead to confusion and the children getting a meal they wouldn't necessarily have chosen. Thanks for your help.

Year 6 Outstanding Arrears

As our Year 6 children approach their final weeks with us at Lanchester EP, can we politely ask that you check your Arbor account regularly over the coming weeks to ensure that any outstanding balances are cleared for dinner money, wrap around care and school trips? If you pay for your childcare using vouchers or tax-free child care, please ensure these payments are made before Monday 1st July to cover until the end of term. This allows us time to process them and attribute them to your Arbor account. Thank you for your support in this matter.

SEND News

Durham County Council has been informed this week that it will be receiving an inspection from Ofsted and the Care Quality Commission. This is to inspect the local arrangements for children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND).

The Inspectors want to know about the help and support that children and young people with SEND in County Durham get. You can tell them by filling in a survey. What you tell them will be treated in confidence.

There are separate surveys for children and young people with SEND and parents and carers of a child or young person with SEND.

Key Stage One News

1 Overview

regularly. They can be used in cases where absence has not been authorised by a head teacher. Penalty notices are issued as an alternative to prosecution where parents have failed to ensure their child attends school

not appropriate (for example, leave of absence during term time). Changes from September 2024 are shown below. The notices are used to prevent the need for court action, for example, when support has not been engaged with or is

2 Leave

Head Teachers are unable to grant leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Generally, a need or desire for a holiday or other absence for the purpose of leisure and recreation would not constitute an exceptional circumstance.

3 Absence

A Fixed Penalty Notice may be issued if there are 5 days / 10 sessions of absence in a period of 10 school weeks (where absence has not been authorised).

A notice may be issued where the 5-day level of absence has not been reached, for example, if there are several periods of leave.

4 Amount

Within a 3-year period:

The <u>first</u> penalty notice is £160 if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 if paid within 21 days.

A <u>second</u> penalty notice is £160 to be paid within 28 days.

A third penalty notice cannot be issued. **Legal action** may result (for example, prosecution).
