We have a very experienced and active governing body who give up a lot of their own time to both support and challenge the work of our school. The list below is our current governing body.



Year 3 Urban Pioneers

As part of their new topic on Urban Pioneers, which covers how cities have developed and changed over the centuries and includes looking at street artists and their work, Year 3 have worked with a graffiti artist in school. They explored the history of street art and how stencils are used, as well as designing and creating their own piece of graffiti artwork using spray paints!

Captain Chemistry

Headlice

Headlice can be a problem in many schools. 
