Dear Parents and Carers,

With just one week left of the term, it feels like we are limping to the finishing line with so many germs and bugs doing the rounds. It always seems to be the same at this time of the year. But at least we have not had to postpone any nativities – unlike last year!

Unfortunately, I have succumbed to the flu epidemic this week which has totally wiped me out, resulting in me not being able to be in work all week – not like me at all! So, apologies for a lack of replies to emails – I will be catching up over the weekend.

I was bitterly disappointed to miss both the Nursery and Reception nativities this week which I have heard were absolutely delightful. I hope they were a lovely start to your festive celebrations. The most important thing to us is that the children enjoy it and I have been told by a number of different people that they most certainly did that! Well done to them all – we are always so proud of our children.

Generosity

Thank you so much for amazing generosity with the Christmas Fair last Friday. We counted over £1900 from the day itself and the actual profit is over £1600 which is wonderful. We will let you know what this is used for but it always goes directly back to the children here. It was a mad hour, but so enjoyable and a lovely atmosphere. Thank you all for braving the crowds!

We took £568.65 at the Scholastic Book Fair which meant we earned £227.54 worth of commission in books. We have already purchased additional books for our library with this. Thank you!

Rota kids raised £316.19 for Wacky Hair Day and another £100 last week at the Christmas Fair. They will be purchasing toys for the local Salvation Toy Appeal which helps to ensure local children receive a present this Christmas.

We also raised £408.17 on Children in Need Day which is being split between them and the Jamaican Hurricane Appeal – as requested by some of our children.

The Early Years Autumn Treasure Hunt raised £341.10 which is going back into Early Years to purchase additional resources for their unit.

In addition, we had some of our girls raise over £240 at the Village Green Christmas Light Switch On for Henry Dancer Days. Last week at the Christmas Fair, two of our Year 5 boys raised £56 for Willowburn, making Christmas Tree Decorations out of wood. We are very proud of these children for doing something for others and really making a difference in their local community. This type of social action is a shining example of our school's Christian values of Love and Kindness. Well done!

Christmas Priorities

This time of year often brings with it a pressure for many parents and carers to create the perfect magical Christmas with the best presents possible. I know that many of you do feel that pressure and stress of money. However, do you remember the gifts that you received as a child? I certainly don't.
