SEND News

Durham County Council has asked us to share information about the FEARless course that will be taking place on Monday afternoons at the Stanley Family Hub, beginning in January. FEARless is a course for parents/carers of children aged 6-14 years. The course helps where you have a child who has anxiety which might be causing them to miss school or social events. It will help you to understand your child's anxiety, recognise when your child is anxious and develop skills and techniques to help your child cope with their anxiety. Sessions run for two hours a week over six weeks. To find out more and to sign up for the course, please click here.

Thank you to everyone who completed last half-term's questionnaire for parents and carers of children with SEND. One point that a few parents and carers made was about the changes to Mr McLoughlin's responsibilities this year. For the past two years, we have been able to have Mr McLoughlin not attached to a class. This meant that whilst he still had teaching commitments across the school, he did not have his own class and had a great deal of flexibility to meet promptly with parents and carers.

This year, due to budget constraints, he has had to go back into class and is the class teacher for one of our Year 1 classes, in addition to his role as special needs co-ordinator (SENCO) across the school. He has one day per week out of class for his SENCO responsibilities and has some dedicated times during this day available to meet with parents and carers. However, if you would like to discuss your child's specific needs, their class teacher is always the best person to speak to first, as they work most closely with your child throughout the week.

Year 5 and 6 Christmas Performance – Christmas 1914.



Year 5 and 6 are busy learning songs and lines for their performance of Christmas 1914. The play is set in August 1914 at the beginning of the First World War. The story tracks Joe and his friends as they rush off to enlist to the army, leaving anxious families and friends behind. Once the grim reality of war takes hold, letters to and from the trenches become ever more important. As Christmas comes, the community gathers for a carol concert, whilst even the misery of the trenches is briefly lightened by the Christmas Truce. The show ends with a poignant moment of remembrance for absent loved ones as thoughts turn to the birth of Jesus. Everyone is looking forward to sharing this story with you on Thursday 14th December at 2pm and 6pm.

What Schools Need to Know about

WHAT THE ACT WILL DO The Online Safety Act was passed into UK law in October 2023, with the aim of establishing major new layers of protection for children when they're online. The government has pledged "a zero-tolerance approach to protecting children from online harm", and the act certainly includes more powerful legislation which should help to safeguard young people in the digital world. Our guide summarises the key points for schools ...

HARMFUL CONTENT

Social media sites must rapidly remove illegal and/or harmful content and/or harmful content such as bullying or harassing comments; pornography; and content that supports extremist activity or encourages or depicts violence, suicide, self harm or eating disorders. If they fail to do so, they can be fined up to 10% of their global revenue while their executives may even trans tall trans in the such that their executives may even trans tall trans tall

NON-CONSENSUAL SHARING

REPORTING AND FILTERING

Sites should have easy reporting mechanisms for children (or their parents and carers) to flag up problems quickly. They must also provide options to filter out unwanted content.

AGE-RESTRICTED MATERIAL



The act has some specific implications for schools: it's essential that leaders understand the new legislation's scope and limitations. The act is certainly a positive step, but as artificial intelligence and other advances in tech continue to produce new challenges, schools will still need to remain extremely vigilant.

KNOW WHERE TO GET HELP

Look out for the Code of Conduct that Ofcom is creating in response to the Online Safety Act. Note that the new legislation doesn't mean an instant change: many of its elements will only come into force at the end of 2023. A Ofcom consultation on 'protecting people from illegal harms online' will be running until February 2024.

REMEMBER THE ESSENTIALS

Remain mindful of your organisation's own anline activities: the legal duty for schools to maintain appropriate software monitoring and filtering, for example, will not change.

WATCH FOR FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

There are some issues on which the legislation remains less clear for now: whether it's possible for Ofcom to scan encrypted private messages (such as on whatsApp) has yet to be resolved, for instance—making this an area where, for the moment, young people have less legal protection.

UNDERSTAND AND EXPLAIN

Staff should learn how to raise concerns with tech companies whose platforms contain anything upsetting or unpleasant. Students also need to be made aware of the newly strengthened laws relating to cyber-bullying, sexting or posting inappropriate content. Young people do make mistakes online – so the clearer their understanding of the possible consequences, the better.
