

Nursery Library



Year 4

Year 5

It was fascinating to hear about his life and travels.

The Royal Shakespeare Company

This week, Year 5 and 6 have enjoyed workshops with Connor from the Royal Shakespeare Company. The children have been developing their thespian acting skills, with the work set around William Shakespeare's 'The Tempest.' Both year groups thoroughly enjoyed their drama lesson and it was clear to see their self-confidence grow during the workshops.

On Thursday, Years 4, 5 and 6 were given the privilege of watching the RSC's production of the Tempest. *Shakespeare's play* is about a magician named Prospero, who lives on a magical island with his daughter, Miranda. After a shipwreck brings his enemies to the island, Prospero uses his magic to make them face their mistakes. In the end, he forgives them and returns home to reclaim his throne. This was a wonderful and amazing opportunity for the children, who enjoyed every second of the production.
