Key Stage One News

Year 1

Year 1 children have begun reading their new focus text this week: 'Vlad and The Great Fire of London.' They have learnt lots about the fire that destroyed a large part of London in 1666 through the eyes of Vlad (a flea) and his friend Boxton (a rat). Over the next couple of weeks they'll be writing their own diary entries, imagining that they were in London when the fire took hold.

The highlight of the week for Year 1 has certainly been their visit to Newcastle as part of their 'Bright Lights, Big City' topic. They were able to explore the features of a city to extend their learning from recent Geography lessons. They were also able to find out about another great fire that was much closer to home: the Great Fire of Gateshead and Newcastle.



Year 2

In Year 2 this week, the children have been working hard on writing their own version of Handa's Surprise. Everyone has worked so hard to include wonderful adjectives in their writing to make it really come alive.

The Y2 children have also had their paintbrushes out this week, as they have been practising their observational art skills by painting fruit. They have taken their time to observe the fruit well before painting and their hard work is certainly paying off. We have some excellent artists in Y2!

Key Stage Two News

We are fast approaching the end of what has been a very busy but exciting second half of the spring term. We have been lucky enough to have children experiencing very different parts of the world over this term – the glitz of Dubai, the scenery and snow of the French Alps and the culture of India. Over the next two weeks we have groups of children in Year 3 and 4 heading up to Hadrian's Wall and to Seahouses for their residential visits. Year 6 Visit to the Centre for Life

On Tuesday, our Year 6 children headed to Newcastle to the Centre for Life. The visit was linked to our 'Powering the Future' project in conjunction with Glasgow Science Centre. The children are considering energy and climate change and how burning of fossil fuels can be replaced by renewable sources to meet energy demand. During the visit, the children took part in a workshop, where they carried out experiments to show how wind and the sun can be harnessed to produce electricity. They also spent time exploring the centre's exhibits, enjoyed looking at constellations in the planetarium and watched live experiments in the theatre.

Year 5 Rugby Event

On Wednesday afternoon, Y5MS participated in rugby event held at Consett Rugby Club. Whilst there the children engaged in some rugby skills sessions that were led by Young Leaders from Consett Academy, that included two of our former pupils! Following that, they concluded the afternoon with small sided tag rugby games. Great fun was had by all!



Captain Chemistry in Year 3

Captain Chemistry spent Tuesday working with both of our Year 3 classes. As part of their 'I am Warrior' topic, the sessions focussed on Roman engineering. The children looked at how Roman architecture led to the construction of bridges and viaducts, before building their own structures. After that, the classes took part in their own version of 'Horrible Histories' by investigating which material was best for wiping Roman bottoms! Everyone enjoyed the fascinating and 'handson' workshops.
