Key Stage One News

It has been another busy and exciting week in KS1 with lots of interesting things happening. In Year 1 the children really enjoyed getting outside in Science this week. The children learned about common garden and wild plants and then went on a hunt around the forest and school grounds to see if we could recognise any plants. The staff were amazed at the children's knowledge of plants and how many different species they could recognise. I have also been so impressed by the writing in Year 1 this week. We have been writing a diary entry from the Great Fire of London and the children have written some amazing sentences using their senses to describe what they could see, hear and smell during the Great Fire. Next week we are all looking forward to our DT week when we will be using sliders and levers to make a moving picture book.

In Year 2, all the talk has been about times tables and the TT Rockstars battle between both classes which has lasted all week. Things got very competitive but eventually Mr Osmond's class came out victorious and Mrs Tate may have to wash Mr Osmond's car as a result! Well done to all the children who spent so much time on TT Rockstars this week. Mrs Tate and Mr Osmond have been blown away by how hard you have all worked.

Year 2 have also started a new book in English called Handa's Surprise and have been working really hard to learn their story map and doing some excellent reading and writing.

Key Stage Two News

We are approaching the end of what has been a very busy but exciting second half of the spring term. We have been lucky enough to have children experiencing very different parts of the world over this term — the glitz of Dubai, the scenery and snow of the French Alps and the culture of India. These are amazing memories for staff and children that will last a lifetime. We are very lucky at Lanchester EP.

This week, Year 5 and 6 have been supporting the work of Lanchester Parish Council to create a 'solar trail' along the Lanchester Valley Cycle Path. The children have been considering what they would put into a time capsule to be opened 50 years into the future, thinking about space travel and writing about themselves for someone in the future to read. This is an exciting project that will lead to the creation of a scale model of the solar system along the cycle path. The 'sun' will be located in Lanchester and the planets will be lined along

the trail towards Consett, with information about each one for walkers and cyclists to read. Two children from Lanchester EP will be invited to the official opening of the trail in the summer.

After the Easter holidays, each year group will begin their new topic. Year 3 will travel back in time to the Anglo Saxon period, whilst Year 4 will find out about Consett Steelworks in their Mighty Metals topic. Year 5 will head to the hills for their Misty Mountains, Winding River topic and Year 6 will jet off to Mexico to find out about the history and culture of the country.

We hope you all have a great Easter break with your families and we look forward to seeing you after the holidays.
