Reception

Key Stage One News

Both year groups in Key Stage One have begun new units of learning in RE this half-term.

In Year 1, the children are learning about the story of Matthew in the Bible. They have been finding out about how he became one of Jesus' disciples, and this week they have been creating their own comic strips to tell the story of how Matthew decided to follow Jesus. This will lead onto learning more about the Gospels and how Jesus demonstrated forgiveness through his actions and teachings.

The children in Year 2 have begun to learn about the idea of 'belonging' in different religions. This week, they have been learning about different symbols and objects that people use to show belonging to Christianity and to Islam. This has been a lovely way to reflect on learning that they have undertaken earlier in the year linked to both religions.

Both Year 1 and 2 both worked really hard with the cricket coach this week, honing their super sport skills. Year 2 have also enjoyed working with Captain Chemistry today, completing numerous experiments all about electricity, looking at their heart rates, completing electrical circuits and seeing the power of static electricity. They have had a great time seeing science in action.



On Friday next week, Year 1 will be travelling to Burnopfield Primary School to take part in an exciting multi sports festival. The event has a Disney theme and the children are welcome to wear Disney-related clothes if they would like to. The children should come to school wearing either their Disney-related clothes or their PE kit.
