Morning Snacks

Please remember however, that all children in Early Years, Year 1 and Year 2 receive a piece of fruit free of charge due to a government scheme. If your child brings a piece of fruit for morning playtime, it does need to be stored separately from their packed lunch as they are not allowed to access their packed lunches until dinnertime. Early Years News

The children in Nursery and Reception are very much enjoying exploring the seasonal changes as the weather is cooling and the days are getting shorter. These provide us with so many opportunities for rich conversations and vocabulary development. Moving forward, we are planning for Reception children to enjoy time in the forest every Thursday. We have waterproofs and wellies in school, so they don't need anything extra bringing to school, but it might be a good idea to dress them in comfortable grey or black joggers/leggings on Thursdays (rather than skirts/dresses or grey school trousers) to help them feel comfortable when they are in the forest.

Reception had the experience of joining with Year One for their Harvest Festival on Wednesday. They sang a song and recited a poem that they have been learning. We were so impressed by their listening skills in the hall! Year One sang the Harvest Samba for us and helped out with Miss Butler's retelling of The Little Red Hen. Great work from all of you!

The children have thoroughly enjoyed exploring the textures and scents of the different flowers and they have very much enhanced our creative areas indoors and mud kitchen area outside.
