Dear Parents and Carers,

I am sure that the parents and carers of those children in Northern Ireland will all be looking forward to having them back later on tonight. Please keep an eye out on 'X' for their estimated time of arrival but it is expected that they should be back at school for around 10.00pm.

Four of our Year 5 children had an amazing experience when they represented the school at Durham Youth Council's Big Debate on Wednesday where they were finding out about democracy in action and how councils work before participating in debate sessions on a range of topics from banning smoking and vaping for all people through to use of social media in under 18's. They listened to arguments from members of the Youth Council before then being able to have their say. We were very proud of them and hope it has given them a taste for public speaking in the future.

Reception had a wonderful visit to the beach yesterday – I am sure they would all sleep well last night! A huge thank you to all the parents and carers who also came along and made the whole day possible. We could not do it without you!

Update on Staffing for Next Year

I would like to inform you that from September, I will be reducing my hours and working the equivalent of 4 days per week. The decision to reduce my workload has come about due to a number of personal reasons; my eldest daughter is moving abroad, I have a 90-year old mum, my husband is retired and I just feel that the time has come for me to have a little more work/life balance. Governors have agreed that this day off can be taken flexibly over the course of a half term to enable me to visit my daughter more regularly. I will still have total strategic overview of the school, with total responsibility for the leadership of the school but Mr Knighton will manage the school in my absence. Parents, carers and children will hopefully not notice any difference on a daily basis as for the last few years, I have been out of school regularly for residentials, conferences and meetings. When I am not at work, I will put an out of office signature on my emails.

The information about classes will be emailed to you next week. I am sure you can imagine that this is always a really important piece of work and something that cannot be rushed – we want to get it right.

Turing Funding Application

I am absolutely thrilled to inform you that, for the 5th consecutive year, we have been successful in securing the Turing funding for our school. We have been granted almost £50,000 for visits to Delhi, Dubai, Shanghai and Istanbul next year. This is just amazing news, especially as we know of some other local schools who were unsuccessful this time. Mr McLoughlin dedicates a lot of time to completing these applications and I am very grateful to him.

It is amazing that, once again, a number of our children will enjoy a trip of a lifetime! My only wish is that we could take them all. We will also be able to take some additional children on these visits, just like we managed to this year, thanks to some additional money that has been donated into this account.

Mr McLoughlin and I will be meeting shortly to start organising dates for these visits and will be emailing parents and carers of children in Years 5 & 6 to find out who would like their child to be considered for each of the visits.

Summer Fair & Yanomamo Raffle

The Friends of the School are organising the summer fair this year which will take place on Friday 11th July from 3.30pm until 5.30pm. They are organising lots of stalls and activities and I am sure it is going to be another wonderful event in the life of our school. We are holding a non-uniform day on Friday 4th July in exchange for donations for the summer fair. We would really appreciate donations of toiletries, wine, chocolates and gifts that we can use at the fair. Donations of alcohol should be brought into school with an adult.

We are also having a raffle in the run up to the performance of Yanomamo. Tickets will be £5 per strip or £1 per ticket and will be on sale from Monday 30th June. We will also be selling tickets at the performances. We'd be grateful for vouchers, coupons, alcohol, gift sets, boxed chocolates/ biscuits etc. Thank you very much for your help in making this a great success!

Water Day

Planning water day is always a headache! The aim is, naturally, to hold it on a hot, sunny day! But we always have so much going on in school that it is very tricky to co-ordinate! The weather forecast for today was for dull, cooler and blustery weather which is why we decided to postpone it. The forecast for Monday (at the moment!) is for full sun all day and 25 degree heat! I only hope this doesn't change! But it will have to go ahead on Monday whatever happens with the weather!

Yanomamo

The rehearsals for this are going exceptionally well – it is going to be a very powerful show! Ticket sales are going well but please remember that you have until **Wednesday 2nd July 2025** to purchase up to 2 tickets per performance. After this date, we cannot guarantee tickets as they will go on sale on a first-come-first-serve basis. More tickets for each performance will go on free sale from Thursday 3rd July.

Day of the Performance: Thursday 10th July

Please note the following important points about the day of the show on Thursday 10th July:

- There are two performances and all children are required at both shows. We have one performance at 1.30pm followed by another at 6pm. We have the evening performance to allow working parents the opportunity to attend. However, the main reason for two shows is to allow the children to perform to as many people as possible. They have all worked so hard and have so much talent, that it seems only right and fair to do two performances.
- We will be at the Empire Theatre all day. Many of you completed the form saying you would be able to drop off at the theatre for 9am and pick up at 2.50pm. Thank you so much for this this has saved the school over £2,000 on the cost of buses. That is a huge saving for our school. Those children who are unable to be dropped off at the Empire are to come to school as normal and will be transported to and from the theatre by bus. If you did not fill in the form but can take your child to and from the theatre then that would be great. If your child is being dropped off at school then they must be in on time, as the buses will need to leave promptly. All Key Stage 2 registers will be taken at the theatre.
- All Key Stage 2 children will need to take a packed lunch to the theatre, along with a drink.
- For the evening performance, ALL children are to be dropped off at the theatre for 5.40pm. The evening performance will finish at approximately 7.30pm.

Yanomamo Costumes

The children are all required to wear different items for the show. We are providing some items and the children are making some accessories too.

Year 6 Girls – smart office/school wear

Year 6 Boys – jeans, white t-shirt, boots
