Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been lovely to welcome the children back to school this week. The staff come in during the holidays to prepare for the new year but the building is always just soulless without the buzz, chatter and laughter the children bring with them!

### **Her Majesty The Queen**

Like the rest of the country, we too were deeply saddened to hear the news about the death of the Queen last night. We have held a special assembly in school this morning for children in Years 1-6 where her life has been remembered and celebrated. We also talked about her being a normal human being with emotions and feelings, finishing by showing the children the more humorous side of our Queen with Paddington Bear and James Bond! We will continue to support the children with their emotions as I am well aware that it may also be hard for some of our children who have lost loved ones in the past.

### **Henry Dancer Days**

This is a charity very close to our hearts. Henry came here as a pupil for over 8 years and was such a wonderful young boy before he sadly lost his fight for life at just 12 years old due to bone cancer. We still have his photograph up in our staff room, remembering him very fondly, while his mum attends our leavers service every summer to award the Henry Dancer Memorial trophy to a Y6 boy who displays the same characteristics as Henry did as a child.

Leaving them in school works really well and means that all children have the same water bottle so we don't have any issues with peer pressure over the latest trending water bottle!

### **Uniform Donations**

Thank you for all your uniform donations – these are really useful, and during the cost of living crisis it is lovely for us to be able to provide uniform to parents free of charge. However, we are asking that if you donate jumpers or cardigans that it is the logoed items only – we suggest donating the unbranded jumpers to charity instead, as whilst your child will not be penalised for wearing an unbranded jumper or cardigan, it is our policy that children should wear the logoed jumpers. We do have a number of unbranded jumpers that have already been donated into school – we will put these in the bike shelter for people to collect until Wednesday. Anything not collected by then will be taken to charity.

### **Labelling Clothes**

Please make sure all uniform, shoes and coats are labelled with your child's name (or initials) and class. This makes it much easier for us to find it in the event it goes missing and to reunite it with its owner. We would like to keep the lost property down to a minimum this year as we simply don't have the space to keep it, so please help us to help you and label your child's clothing.

- Upload things that your child has done outside of school that you think the teacher would like to see.

Reception children also need a book bag in their team colour. Bookbags are available from Moette in Langley Park, if you have yet to purchase one. Please remember to check your child's book bag each night as they may contain letters or all-important party invitations!

### 2 Year Olds Questionnaire

Last year we sent out a link to parents and carers to find out if there would be any interest in sending your children to Nursery if we could offer places for 2-year olds. There most definitely is the interest there from you all but unfortunately, at this current point in time, we just do not have the capacity to be able to offer this provision. Our Nursery continues to be almost at capacity for 3-year olds and we would need additional space/building to be able to accept 2-yr olds. I am in contact with the Local Authority about this as I am well aware of a lack of provision for our Under 3s in the village. This is something which we most definitely are aiming towards but it looks as though it may be a rather long process.

# Free School Milk (Nursery & Reception)

All children in Nursery and Reception are signed up for free milk before they start with us (unless there are any allergies or dietary requirements we are aware of). This ensures that your child gets milk from the day they start and parents will only need to sign them up once they turn five and are no longer eligible for the free milk. Unfortunately, there seems to have been a bit of confusion about that this year. We will do our best to make sure your child receives milk each day, but a number of children will not receive milk from coolmilk until 19<sup>th</sup> September.

# Year 2 Visit to Hartlepool Marina on Monday 12th September

On Monday, Year 2 are going on their first educational visit of the year. They will be enjoying a wonderful day at Hartlepool Marina to support this term's topic of 'Land Ahoy'. # **Turing Visits to India and Dubai**

The children who will travel to India in January were all chosen and informed during the summer holidays. It is hoped that this will also be organised this month and we are hoping to travel there in February. We are just waiting to hear back from our partner school before the final dates are confirmed.

# **Confirmation Classes**

We are, once again, in a position to be able to offer Confirmation Classes to children in Years 5 & 6 who would like to become confirmed into the Church of England. Revd Lesley Sutherland will lead these classes during the school day along with her curate, Revd Stephen. Letters will go out shortly to parents and carers of Year 5 and Year 6 children with more details about what this involves and for you to give your permission for your child to attend the classes. The Bishop will be confirming the children at a service on Sunday 20<sup>th</sup> November. Look out for more information to follow.

### **Swimming Timetable Information**

Since 1994, swimming and water safety has been a statutory element of the national curriculum for physical education in England. This means that every 11-year old child should leave primary school with the skills to keep themselves safe while enjoying swimming with friends and family.

Every half term, we send a different Key Stage 2 class swimming to the Louisa Centre. Swimming takes place on Thursday mornings and when it is your child's turn to go swimming they will need to bring into school a swimming costume, towel and a swim hat. Swim hats must be worn in the pool; if your child does not have one, you can send in £2.50 with your child in an envelope for them to purchase one from the Louisa Centre in the first week of their swimming lessons. Please note, goggles are not permitted to be worn during swimming lessons. The rules on swimming hats and goggles are Local Authority rules by which we have to abide.

This makes sure that staff have the most up to date information. If you decide after this date that you would like your child to walk home unaccompanied, please contact the office. Thank you.

# Whole School Walk – Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> September

This is always a very popular day and one which the children and staff both thoroughly enjoy. It is part of our curriculum and school calendar and like any other educational visit, is not optional. # **Physical Education**

The children have 2 PE lessons every week (one of these may be Swimming). For children in Years 1-4, PE kits should remain in school for the duration of the half term. Children in Years 5 & 6 are to come to school dressed in their PE kits for the days they have PE. However, Year 5 & 6 children must still wear their ordinary school jumper and NOT an ordinary hoodie for their PE day and lessons.

Please note – Nursery and Reception do not change for any PE lessons they have as they have regular movement lessons. Reception children will need to bring a PE kit to school after Easter but more information will be shared on this nearer the time.
