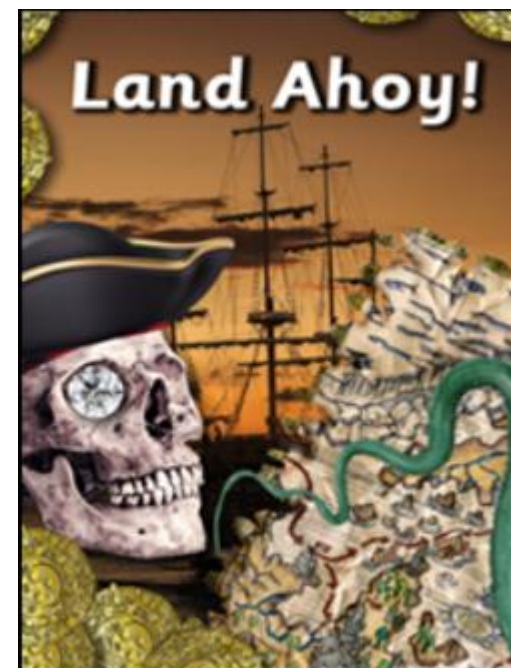


Land Ahoy
