We will be offering both 15-hour and 30-hour places in our 2 year-old room, with children automatically moving to the main 3-4's room when they are ready.

Coffee Afternoon on Friday 16th May

On Friday 16th May at 2:15pm, we are very pleased to have an advisory teacher from the Emotional Wellbeing Team and a specialist Emotional Resilience nurse coming into school to meet with parents and carers to talk about anxiety in children. This is to build on some recent training that all staff have undertaken to help support children who may be anxious. We will be holding this as an informal coffee afternoon and parents and carers are very welcome to come along to find out more about how to support children who are anxious, as well as different support networks that are available in our local area. We hope that this will be a useful afternoon for many families in our school community.

Yanomamo

Rehearsals for our KS2 musical have now started with children learning the songs in music lessons and singing with great gusto! Yanomamo is an ecological musical which describes the crisis situation in the Amazon Basin, where rainforest trees are being felled for use as commercial timber, the land cleared for ranching, and thousands of peasants from Brazil's overcrowded cities arrive in search of a better life. The Yanomami is the oldest Indian tribe living in the forest. Unlike our own civilisation, which uses natural resources with little thought for the future, the Yanomami lead a way of life in harmony with nature which, undisturbed, would survive with the forest for the next twenty thousand years and more. The Indians' existence, and that of millions of animal and plant species, is threatened by the destruction of the trees and the arrival of the incomers.

Auditions will be taking place on Wednesday 21st May for soloists, small groups of singers and for our narrators. Children auditioning for the singing parts are asked to prepare a song of their choice (unaccompanied) to sing. They may also be asked to sing part of the final song from the show as well.
