Year 1

The children in Year 1 have been learning about The Wright Brothers in History lessons as part of their project 'Splendid Skies.' Captain Chemistry Visit

Year 5 welcomed Captain Chemistry into their Science lesson this week, where they had a "blast" carrying out a range of experiments on different materials and their properties. They looked at a range of solids, liquids and gases, checked out some amazing chemical reactions and tested a range of mixtures and solutions. All the experiments were carried out with great enthusiasm, the highlight being the combustion investigation!

Year 3 enjoyed working with Captain Chemistry this week on our science topic of light. We investigated how light travels, how shadows are made and change and enjoyed using prisms to see the colours that make up light. The spy pens were a huge hit! The children wrote secret messages that could only be read using ultraviolet light.
