Year 6 Leavers Hooded Jumpers

Year 6 Leavers hooded jumpers will be available to buy on your child's Arbor account in the School Shop area from today. The cost is £20 and we will sort out the size your child needs in school next week when we have the samples delivered. Payment for the jumper must be made by 1st May so that we can place the order in time to get them delivered before half term.

Paying for Trips & Wrap Around Care

Going forward, trips will be added to your child's Arbor account. Wrap around care can also be booked and paid for via the system and seems to be very straight forward. Previously, those paying by childcare vouchers could not book their child onto wrap around care - this is now possible. It is also possible for free school meal children to book onto breakfast club without being charged.

Please make sure you book your child onto wrap around care, as it makes it so much easier for staff and children when we know who is supposed to be attending. If you have booked your child onto the club and no longer want them to attend, you need to contact the school office, although if your child is not marked as attending the club, you will not be charged anyway.

Updating Details on Arbor

Please make sure you familiarise yourself with Arbor and make any required changes to your child's details - this is how we will be sending information home from now on and where staff will retrieve details about your child (such as their medical needs and dietary requirements). Over the next term, we plan to put photo consents and Year 5 & 6 Walk Home consents onto Arbor as well, which will again make it easier for you to see what you have consented for. This will also mean staff will be updated immediately if there is any change to consent.

School Trips

We place a huge emphasis on learning outside the classroom and as a result, ensure our children have many experiences on both day trips and residentials. We aim to make them as affordable as possible, as well as giving you as much time as possible to pay for them, prior to the trips taking place. However, we are very conscious that they have increased in price recently which is mainly due to the cost of hiring the coaches as well as increased entry costs. Please be reassured that we always subsidise the visits from our school budget as much as possible as well as giving children eligible for Free School Meals all trips at a vastly reduced cost.

Early Years News

We have loved having the children back to school this week. We have had such a busy week with Nursery and Reception exploring the forest for signs of spring. In Reception, the children have been busy baking bread with Mrs Riddell to link with the story of The Little Red Hen.

It has been wonderful to be able to spend more time outside in the warmer weather. Please remember on warm days that your child will need sun protection applying before they come to school. We also need your permission to apply sunscreen throughout the day as needed so if you have not already done so, please ensure that you have signed and returned a permission form. If your child needs their own sunscreen, please send it into school labelled clearly with their name.

The children in Nursery have been showing an interest in sea life and pirates since returning to Nursery, so if anyone has any pirate themed costumes or toys they would like to donate, they would be very much appreciated.

A few general reminders:

- Can you check that you have returned your child's wellies and spare clothes bag to school after the holidays?
- Please make sure ALL jumpers/cardigans are clearly labelled with your child's name.
- Reception children will need PE kit from this half term. This MUST be clearly named to avoid items going missing.

Key Stage 1 News

It has been a really nice return to school this week. The children seem to have had a good rest over the Easter Holidays and come back excited and ready to learn about their new topics.

Both Year 1 and 2 have topics learning about gardens, woodlands and plants this half term. The fantastic weather this week has meant that we have been able to get outside and there has been a wonderful buzz around the Key Stage as children have been planting seeds and watching them to see if they grow.

Year 1 will be taking part in Forest School as part of their topic this half term on a Thursday afternoon. Please could children bring in a set of clothes for Forest School. They will need strong shoes, long trousers or leggings and a long sleeve top as arms must be covered around the fire pit. Weekly sessions will alternate between the two classes.

Finally, just a reminder that reading books and reading records need to come into school **every day** in your child's book bag. We have had quite a few books missing this week so if you could send them in it would be much appreciated.

Key Stage 2 News

Everyone in Key Stage 2 would like to welcome you back to the summer term. We hope you all had a lovely Easter break with your families.

The summer term is always extremely busy for the children – especially our Year 6, who are working hard in preparation for their SATs, which begin on the 9th May.
