Children in Reception to Year 6 will receive a copy of their official Attendance Certificate today. This is so you can keep track of your child's attendance percentage. At Lanchester EP, we have an attendance target of 97%. On your child's school report at the end of the year, you will see a breakdown of attendance percentages and what they mean:

How Attendance Percentages are Calculated The way attendance is calculated is as a percentage on the number of sessions that your child is able to attend up to the date the certificate is printed off. Each day is split into 2 sessions. Therefore, up to 21 st November (which is when the Attendance Certificates were printed), your child had the opportunity to attend school for 98 sessions, or 49 morning sessions & 49 afternoon sessions. If your child missed 1 full day of school (2 sessions) their attendance percentage would be 98%. However, if your child does not miss anymore sessions, their percentage will go up through the year.					

We completely understand that there are many times when you are unable to bring your child into school. However, it is our duty, as set out by the Department for Education, to monitor your child's attendance and to inform you of our expectations. If you have any questions regarding your child's attendance certificate, or would like to speak to our Attendance Officer Lesley Sabourn, please email the School Office and she will get in touch with you. She is in school every other Tuesday. She will be back into School on Tuesday 6th December.

Reporting a Pupil Absence

If your child is not going to be in school for any reason, it is imperative that you let the School Office know by either phoning on 01207520436 and leaving a message on the absence line, or emailing <u>school.office@lanchesterep.net</u>. Please note, if your child is not in due to illness it is important that you tell us the symptoms they are off with – please do not just say 'unwell'. We need to be able to see patterns in absence and this could help us to map any outbreaks of illness in school, as well as to protect any vulnerable children & staff.

Individual & Sibling Photographs – Ordering Information

You should have received the proof for your child's individual and sibling photograph this week, along with information about how to purchase your photos. Orders should be placed either online by visiting <u>Jane</u> <u>Stapleton School & Nursery Photography (jssp.co.uk)</u> or via telephone on 01773717984 (Monday-Friday 9.30am-4.30pm). The access code for your images is on the proof slip (beginning p000...) – if you have lost your slip, then please email the School Office who can provide you with the code. Orders need to be placed by **Tuesday 6th December** and will be delivered back into school within 2 weeks or can be delivered to your home for 99p. Any orders placed after Tuesday 6th December will not be delivered into school and will be subject to an increased £3.99 delivery charge to your home.

Individual & Sibling Photographs – New Date for Absences

If your child was absent from school on the day of the individual photographs, or did not get a sibling photograph taken that day, the photography company have agreed to come into school again on Thursday 19th January. If your child missed their individual photo or sibling photo originally, please fill in this form: January Photograph by Friday 13th January, so we can let them know the numbers of children to expect. Please only fill this form in if your child did not have a photograph taken. We will be in touch with you nearer the time with more information.

Road Safety & Community Planning Information

You may have noticed recently that some children have been out in their high visibility vests at drop off times. These are some of our conscientious Road Safety Stars, who are helping to look out for any issues that come up at these key times of the day. A number of issues have already been spotted, including turning in the road, parking on the yellow lines & on keep clear road markings. We plan to make these patrols a regular occurrence in order to better monitor the parking situation around school. Please also remember if you are walking to school with your children the importance of crossing safely and to make sure that you can be seen in all weathers – it is well worth investing in some reflective stickers or strips to help to keep you and your children safe.

Early Years News

Christmas Pegs

Each year we invite the children in Nursery and Reception to decorate a peg to put on our Christmas tree. They can decorate it however they wish, with or without help, and then bring it back to school ready to put on our tree. Our Christmas tree is always special and beautiful because of the individual decorations the children make! Please send your child's peg back into school in a named bag or envelope so they can be stored until it is time to decorate the tree. We are sending the pegs out early to give you plenty of time to get them back to us. When we get to the end of term, your child can bring their peg decoration back home with them to put on their own Christmas tree if they wish.

Nursery Library

We would like to set up a library session twice a week for our Nursery children to borrow a book to take home. If you might be interested in helping to run this on a weekly or occasional basis, please let Miss Brown know. This would involve coming into Nursery to set the books out, checking books in and out and packing books away again – approximately 20 minutes. Sessions would run on Tuesday 11:30 - 11:50 and Thursday 2:55 - 3:15. We hope that if we get a few volunteers, this could be done on a rota basis so it isn't a weekly commitment. If any parents of children further up school would like to get involved, we would welcome the support.

Can you help?

We are always on the hunt for resources to support the children's play throughout EYFS. Currently, we are collecting empty hand soap/ gel dispensers to enhance our creative area in Reception and allow children to dispense their own paints and also (as always!) kitchen equipment such as utensils, old pans, baking trays etc to use in our mud kitchen/water and sand play areas. We are also always on the lookout for items we could use in our home corners, especially clothes/hats/scarves that the children could use for dressing up – ordinary clothes, rather than commercial dressing up costumes, please.
